Club History The Birth of the Manawatu Car Club And Early Motor Sporting Events

Extracts from the Manawatu Car Club Inc. Part 7 1947 -48 Years

Motor Rally

The first post war North Island Motor Rally was run by the N.Z. Sports Car Club, later to become the Wellington Car Club, in 1946 when petrol rationing was still in force after being in Vouge during the whole of the war. This was the first major rally event in the Southern half of the North Island. Nearly all the vehicles would be pre-war models as new cars were not readily available at that period and American cars were absolutely unobtainable because of the American dollar shortage.

The starting points were Auckland, Wellington, Napier and Palmerston North and we travelled overnight finishing at New Plymouth where we were all booked in to Hotels. After the road section concluded we had braking and driving tests at Bell Block Aerodrome. Some of the names I remember were Les Stone (breaking an axel in a Morris 12), Mr E. Vogel Snr. in a Riley who sat at our table at this pub, and Allen Freeman in a Triumph Dolomite. The most amusing thing was the results.

1st A.S. Farland – M.G. Magnette – Palmerston North

2nd Andrew Thompson – M.G.V.A. – Palmerston North

3rd Unknown

4th H. Hollis – M.G.T.C.

4th September 1948:

The first known use of the Ohakea Air Base for the purposes of Motor Sport was on the 4th September 1948. A taxi strip near the old National Airways rooms was used for a standing ¼ mile. This taxi strip is almost 2 miles ling so was ideal for this purpose. The timing was simple and done visually with the use of flags and stop watches, which is the next best thing to electronics for small numbers of entries.

Two of the known entries were H. Hollis in and M.G.T.C. and Allen Freeman in a Triumph Dolomite who covered the standing ¼ in 19 seconds. What did you do to it Allen!!

We are also hopeful of attracting a couple of celebrities to be involved in this event as well.


At the end of 4 rounds, the winner will be presented with the Troy Howard Motors Lucky Lone Lap challenge trophy.

I thought 4 good guys would take 3 hours and it would be all over. Well it took 7 guys and a lady member, 1 % hours and the job was completed.


