Supplementary Regulations for a Clubsport Basic, entry-level motorsport weekend

- Grass Motorkhana
- Grass Autocross
- Single-Car Circuit Sprint
- Sealed Autocross
- Single-Car Sprint

The purpose of the Multi-Event Weekend is to promote entry-level participation in motorsport. This is both for the experienced enthusiast and those who are new to the sport. The emphasis is on fun and enjoyment in a safe environment.

1. JURISDICTION

These are Clubsport Basic events promoted by The Manawatu Car Club (0361). These events are held under the MotorSport New Zealand National Sporting Code and its Appendices and Schedules, specifically Appendix Five, Schedule C- Clubsport and Schedule CL – Superlap. **MotorSport New Zealand Permit No: Basic Permit Number: 231732**

3. VENUE

Manfeild Park Feilding: Circuit Chris Amon and the open grass area known as The Oval

- Sealed Motorkhana on various zones on the 4.5km circuit
- Sealed Autocross on the 4.5km Circuit in reverse direction
- Grass Motokhana on the open area of The Oval
- Grass Autocross on the open area of The Oval

Access to the circuit is via Rata Street on Saturday and for the Grass events via Kawakawa Road on Sunday.

5. ELIGIBILITY & LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

5.1 Driver Eligibility:

1. All drivers must hold a current club membership of a Member club, except for new entrants to motorsport who may compete in two(2) Basic Status Events before being required to join a club.

- 2. Only competitors who complete all four events in the same car will qualify for final points
- 3. Competitors competing on bot Saturday and Sunday only will not score points
- 4. Competitor Understanding: In submitting the entry competitors are deemed to fully understand the MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its relevant Appendices and Schedules. In particular: The National Sporting Code Articles pertaining to protests and competitors obligations, and Appendix Five, Schedule C.

5.2 Classes:

- NARWD: Normally Aspirated Front Wheel Drive
- NAFWD: Normally Aspirated Rear Wheel Drive
- FI2WD+NA2WD over 3500cc: Forced Induction 2 Wheel Drive + Normally Aspirated 2 Wheel Drive over 3500cc
- FI4WD: Forced Induction 4 Wheel Drive

5.3 Vehicle Eligibility

- 1) All vehicles must conform to <u>Schedule A Driver and Vehicle Safety</u>and <u>Schedule C Clubsport</u>
- 2) Competitors must use road tyres for all four events, except for those participating on Saturday only and those competing in NZ Superlap.

To clarify:

- No rally tyres
- No semi-slick tyres
- No snow tyres
- No tyres with 'For Competition Purposes Only' or similar wording on the casing
- No tyres with a wear rate lower than 200

5.4 Safety Apparel:

Drivers must wear apparel that complies with Schedule A for Clubsport Basic events. Schedule A 4 Safety Critical Items

We encourage our competitors use the best safety equipment possible

6. PASSENGERS

Grass Motorkhana: Passengers only at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course

Grass Autocross, Sealed Autocross: Passengers may only be carried in a car with MSNZ homologated full roll cage. Safety gear and apparel must be as per Schedule A. All passengers must sign the passenger indemnity form in the office and wear the wristband provided. The scrutineer is to inspect the passenger seat and harness for compliance with Schedule A. Either the driver or passenger must hold a current Motorsport NZ competition licence. **NZ Superlap:** No passengers

7. DOCUMENTATION, AUDIT SCRUTINEERING & DRIVERS BRIEFING

Documentation:

Scrutineering will take place in the Scrutineering Shed at Manfeild on Saturday from 8am to 9.30am and from 8am to 9am on Sunday. Audits as per MSNZ requirements

Drivers briefing will take place at 9.30am on Saturday at the base of the Pit Lane Complex stairs and 9am on Sunday at the grass venue HQ. NZ Superlap drivers briefing will be at 9:15am on Sunday at the base of the Pit Lane Complex stairs.

8. THE EVENTS

SATURDAY:

• The Sealed Motorkhana will be four low-speed tests around cones set on various parts of the circuit. The time starts from the start box and ends with the vehicle stationary in the finish box. A knocked over cone

adds 5sec to the competitor's time. Two runs per test per competitor will be timed. The best run per test counts. Safety apparel not required.

• The Sealed Autocross will be one lap of the full 4.5km circuit in reverse direction. To control speeds chicanes will be placed on the straights and at the junctions between the 3.0km circuit and the 1.5km circuit.

All competitors will complete a sighting tour in convoy behind a lead vehicle. Competitors will be timed a maximum of three runs. The best run time counts. Safety apparel is compulsory.

For a run competitors will line up in pit lane and be released onto the circuit via Pit Exit. They will turn tightly back towards the start line for a flying start. They will continue around the course in reverse direction, negotiating the chicanes until they cross the finish line for a flying finish. Drivers will need to brake hard to turn right into the pit exit. They will re-join the field in Pit Lane for the next run.

SUNDAY

- The Grass Motorkhana will be up to four low-speed tests marked out with road cones. The time starts from the start box and ends with the vehicle stationary in the finish box. A knocked over cone adds 5sec to the competitor's time. Two runs per test per competitor will be timed. The best run per test counts. Safety apparel not required
- The Grass Autocross will be one run of approximately 3kms of the Manfeild grass area from a standing start box. Competitors will negotiate the cone markers and finish the run stationary in the finish box. A knocked over cone adds 5 sec to the run. Up to three runs per competitor will be timed. The best run counts. Safety apparel is required.

As with the Sealed Autocross competitors will complete a sighting tour of the run in convoy behind a lead car

NZ Superlap Circuit coaching sessions for will take place after Drivers Briefing and before the first run. An experienced MCC race driver will take new drivers around Manfeild in the Safety Car. Superlap Groups 1 to 4 will be released in order fastest to slowest for 12minute sessions throughout the day. The fastest single lap completed in the timed Group sessions counts towards the result.

• Timing

Both the Sealed and Grass Motorkhanas and the Grass Autocross timing will be by stopwatch. The Sealed Autocross will be timed by AMB transponder. Live timing will be available on the MyLaps Speedhive app

• **Results** will be posted on the Official Noticeboard in the Secretary's Office or Service Vehicle at Grass HQ. Printed results by request. Events timed by AMB transponder will have results posted on MyLaps Speedhive.

10. PRIZE GIVING

Will be held at the conclusion of the Grass Autocross on Sunday. Prizes will be awarded to 1st 2nd and 3rd place of each class and 1st, 2nd and 3rd Overall. Other prizes that may be awarded by the organisers.

11. GENERAL INFORMATION

- Open stables are available for pitting on a first-in-first-served basis on Saturday. These need to be vacated by the end of the day
- All used tyres and car parts must be removed from the venue at the conclusion of the event
- Alcohol is not permitted to be consumed by any competitor or their crew at the event before or during the day's competition.
- All Aussie Car Day will be taking place on the grass by Manfeild Park Stadium on Saturday morning.
- Gala Caterers will be on site both days.
