6. ENTRIES & FEES

Entries are \$130 inc GST. Discount for all Manawatu Car Club members

COMPETITORS WILL ENTER USING THE ONLINE SYSTEM. Payments can be made online by credit card or direct credit at http://manawatucarclub.org.nz/product-category/payments/

Entries close on the Thursday leading up to each round date. The main purpose is to enter competitor information into the AMB timing system. Late entries may be accepted on the day of the event.

Refunds: Will be offered to competitors provided they inform the organisers before the first practice run.

If you enter and do not show up without notifying the organisers, no refund will be offered.

NOTE: No entry fees will be carried over to future events.

7. DOCUMENTATION, AUDIT SCRUTINEERING & DRIVERS BRIEFING

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7.1 Documentation will commence at **0800 on the day of the round** and finish at **0930 in the track office at Manfeild.** Late documentation and scrutineering may be carried at the discretion the Clerk of the Course.

7.2 Scrutineering audits will take place in the scrutineering shed at Manfeild. Audits will be done as per MSNZ requirements.

All cars without a MSNZ Competition logbook must be scrutineered.

Audits will take place on the day from 8am to 9:30am or by prior arrangement with the Chief Scrutineer. Late scrutineering is permitted only by arrangement with the Clerk of the Course.

PROTECTIVE CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS: The MINIMUM standard for Clubsport Basic Single Car Sprints is 100% cotton overalls, 100% cotton or 100% woollen underwear and socks, leather shoes.

PLEASE NOTE: Spandex, synthetics or any flammable material is NOT permitted to be worn.

NOTE: We encourage all drivers to purchase the best safety equipment

7.3 Drivers briefing will take place in pit lane outside Pit Lane Garage 1 at 9.35am at all rounds and is compulsory for all competitors.

8. ELIGIBILITY & LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

Clubsport Basic Single-car Sprint

- All vehicles and passenger safety apparel must conform to Safety Schedule A.
- In-car fire extinguishers are not required but recommended.
- No MSNZ licence is required. MSNZ club membership is required unless you have competed in two events or fewer.

9. RUNS

Competitors will assemble in the dummy grid in single file, fastest to slowest. Cars will be released at pit exit one-by-one at minimum 5 second intervals for the warm-up lap. Cars should be at full speed by the time they reach the start line for the flying start indicated by a waved green flag. Drivers will complete three full laps at race speed. The chequered flag will be shown and competitors will complete a full cool-down lap, exit the circuit via the pit lane entry, run down the the pit lane and rejoin the queue for the next run. They can also take the return road to the pit paddock for servicing. All competitors are to complete their first run before the second run starts, and so on.

Drivers may have as many or as few runs as they like through the day, however **the only fastest single lap time set in the competitor's first three official runs will count towards the results.**

Un-timed 'fun-runs' will follow the third official run using the same format. The Organisers reserve the right to end the event

10. PASSENGERS.

Passengers may ONLY be carried in a car with MSNZ homologated full roll cage.

- Safety apparel must be as per Schedule A and 7.2 of these supplementary regulations.
- Seats and harnesses must be audited during the scrutineering process.
- All passengers must sign the passenger indemnity form in the office and wear a wristband.
- The driver or passenger must have a minimum M-Grade competition licence.
- The driver must brief each passenger on the operation of the harness belts and how to exit their car safely.

If an entered driver wishes to be a passenger, they may do so without further documentation.

11. TRACK ENTRY, PIT SET-UP AND GARAGES

Entry to the track will be via the Rata St gates and the South Street entrance.

Pit bays in the stables are free and available on a first-in-first-served basis.

Paddock single garages can be hired for \$100 for the day. Contact Jeff Braid on 027 477 3337

Pit Lane garages are available for hire at \$255 for the day but must be booked in advance through Manfeild Park on 06 323 7444.

Corporate boxes may also be available through Manfeild Park. Prices POA.

12. FIRST AID & FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

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First aid coverage will be provided by for all rounds of the series. The medical vehicle will be parked in pit lane in front of the track office.

Fire Extinguishers will be placed in pit lane at the start line and at the flag points around the circuit.

13. FUEL HANDLING

Competitors are reminded about the Code of Practice for Motorsport Fuel-Storage and Handling. The full detail of this Code is found here: <u>Motorsport NZ Technical: Fuel</u>

14. RESULTS.

Live results will be available through the <u>MyLaps Speedhive</u> Run results will be posted outside the Timing Room on Level 2 of the Pit Lane Complex. Championship results will be published on the MyLaps Speedhive app. **Points** per class are awarded to the first thirty places based on the MSNZ Championship points structure:

15. PRIZE GIVING will be held at the conclusion of the final round on Sunday 5th November. Competitors are invited to remain after the last run to support the prize winners.

Certificates and prizes will be presented to all the winners. The sponsors may include additional prizes at their discretion.

HANDY HINTS: REMEMBER TO:

- Pump up your tyres. 40 psi plus for road tyres, DOT tyres per manufacturers' recommendations.
- Check your oil. Oil surge is common and can wreck your engine. Add half a litre extra to make sure
- Check your water level.
- Check your brake pads and brake fluid. Road compounds can get destroyed very quickly and old brake fluid can boil causing brake fade or brake failure. Roll your car back and forth to stop the pads sticking to the rotors when cooling off.
- Open your bonnet after each run to release engine-bay heat build-up.
- BREATHE! It gets exciting and stressful in the hot seat but try to breathe normally. It will help you drive better!
