Supplementary Regulations for a Clubsport Basic, entry-level motorsport event

- Grass Motorkhana
- Grass Autocross

The purpose of the Grass Skids day is to promote entry-level participation in motorsport. This is both for the experienced enthusiast and those who are new to the sport. The emphasis is on fun and enjoyment in a safe environment.

1. JURISDICTION

This a Clubsport Basic event promoted by The Manawatu Car Club (0361) held under the MotorSport New Zealand National Sporting Code and its Appendices and Schedules, specifically Appendix Five, Schedule C- Clubsport

3. VENUE

Manfeild Park Feilding: Circuit Chris Amon and the open grass area known as The Oval

- Grass Motokhana on the open area of The Oval
- Grass Autocross on the open area of The Oval

Access to the circuit is via Kawakawa Road on Sunday.

4. ENTRIES & FEES

Adults \$100

Children from 12years to 16years \$50

Entries close Midnight Thursday 7th March. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organisers.

5. ELIGIBILITY & LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

5.1 Driver Eligibility:

1. All drivers must hold a current club membership of a Member club, except for new entrants to motorsport who may compete in two(2) Basic Status Events before being required to join a club.
2. Competitor Understanding: In submitting the entry competitors are deemed to fully understand the MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its relevant Appendices and Schedules. In particular: The National Sporting Code Articles pertaining to protests and competitors obligations, and Appendix Five, Schedule C.

5.2 Classes:

- NARWD: Normally Aspirated Front Wheel Drive
- NAFWD: Normally Aspirated Rear Wheel Drive
- FI2WD+NA2WD over 3500cc: Forced Induction 2 Wheel Drive + Normally Aspirated 2 Wheel Drive over 3500cc
- FI4WD: Forced Induction 4 Wheel Drive

5.3 Vehicle Eligibility

- 1) All vehicles must conform to [Schedule A Driver and Vehicle Safety](#) and [Schedule C Clubsport](#)
- 2) Competitors must use standard road tyres

To clarify:

- No rally tyres
- No semi-slick tyres
- No snow tyres
- No tyres with 'For Competition Purposes Only' or similar wording on the casing
- No manually grooved tyres
- No tyres with a wear rate lower than 200

5.4 Safety Apparel:

Drivers must wear apparel that complies with Schedule A for Clubsport Basic events.

6. PASSENGERS

Grass Motorkhana: Passengers only at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course

Grass Autocross Passengers may only be carried in a car with MSNZ homologated full roll cage. Safety gear and apparel must be as per Schedule A. All passengers must sign the passenger indemnity form and wear the wristband provided. The scrutineer is to inspect the passenger seat and harness for compliance with Schedule A. Either the driver or passenger must hold a current Motorsport NZ competition licence.

7. DOCUMENTATION, AUDIT SCRUTINEERING & DRIVERS BRIEFING

Documentation and **Scrutineering** will take place in from 8am to 9.00am Sunday. Audits as per MSNZ requirements. All cars without a MSNZ logbook must be audited.

Drivers briefing will take place at 9.30am or at the conclusion of scrutineering.

8. THE EVENT

- **The Grass Motorkhana** will be two low-speed tests marked out with road cones. The time starts from behind the start line and ends with the vehicle stationary and straddling the finish line. A knocked over cone adds 5sec to the competitor's time. Two runs per test per competitor will be timed. The best run per test counts. Safety apparel not required.
- **The Grass Autocross** will be one run of approximately 3kms of the Manfeild grass area from a standing start box. Competitors will negotiate the cone markers and finish the run stationary in the finish box. A knocked over cone adds 5 sec to the run. Up to three runs per competitor will be timed. The best run counts for the results. Safety apparel is required.
Competitors will complete a sighting tour of the run in convoy behind a lead car followed by one practice run and three timed runs. The best run counts for the results.
Additional 'fun runs' may be offered to drivers depending on the condition of the surface

9. POINTS STRUCTURE, TIMING, AND RESULTS.

- Points for the Multi Event Weekend will be awarded on the following basis per event.

1st	20 Points

The accumulated total per entry over all four events will determine the winners.

- **Timing**
Grass Motorkhanas and the Grass Autocross timing will be by stopwatch.
- **Results** will be posted on the Service Vehicle at Grass HQ. Printed results by request.

10. PRIZE GIVING

Will be held at the conclusion of the Grass Autocross.

Prizes will be awarded to 1st 2nd and 3rd place of each class and 1st, 2nd and 3rd Overall.

Other prizes that may be awarded by the organisers.

11. GENERAL INFORMATION

- All used tyres and car parts must be removed from the venue at the conclusion of the event
- Alcohol is not permitted to be consumed by any competitor or their crew at the event before or during the day's competition.
- Central Districts Field Days will be in the process of setting up
